INTRODUCTION

The NSEMM is a UK-based nonprofit organisation dedicated to making education accessible to all young people in the UK.

Founded in 2020 by two students, Adrian & Socks, NSEMM began as a YouTube channel called "Programmatic Flying", which quickly involved comprehensive tutoring service known as Tutor Eagle. What began as a grassroots initiative, now operates as a communitydriven, and student-run online educational hub, providing individualised tutoring and mentoring to unlock potential in every student.

At NSEMM, we believe that academic success should not be limited by financial barriers. Our services include affordable one-on-one and group tuition, alongside collaborations with schools and community centers to provide tailored educational support where it is needed most. Through initiatives like the **Opportunities** Advancement Award, we offer free tuition to students from schools with a significant proportion of disadvantaged ensuring equitable access to education.

While we started small, NSEMM's ethos of innovation and adaptability has helped us evolve into a vibrant organisation that goes beyond traditional tutoring. Our mentoring programs provide guidance for students navigating academic and career pathways, and we actively support young creatives, offering platforms for emerging talent in art, music, and media.

As a student-led charity, we remain committed to staying connected to the needs of today's learners, fostering an environment where education is accessible, personalised, and impactful. Through our work, we aim to inspire a new generation of students to achieve their full potential and contribute to a brighter future for themselves and their communities.

Our approach is built on collaboration and enhancement rather than competition, ensuring that vital community resources, such as local libraries, are supported rather overshadowed by third-sector organisations. By working directly with councils and local organisations, we integrate our services into existing infrastructure, amplifying the impact of current offerings rather than duplicating or replacing them. It also means we can focus on supporting all young people who access a library, instead of only those who live within a catchment area.

Local libraries, which are often community lifelines, benefit from this partnership. Rather diverting than attention resources away from these spaces, we contribute to their role as educational hubs by adding value through tailored tutoring sessions, mentoring programs, and access online NSEMM Hub. This our collaborative model not only strengthens libraries' ability to serve their communities but also ensures that public funding is used effectively, maximising the reach and efficiency of both council and charity-led initiatives.

MISSION



OUR 2024 GOALS

In reviewing our progress over the past year, we reflect on the goals we set and the extent to which we achieved them. This evaluation helps us understand our impact, identify areas for growth, and ensure that we are on track to meet our mission of making education accessible and supportive for all students.

Closing the Gap

We've made significant progress in our goal to reach more young people from marginalised communities by expanding our tutoring programs and building strong partnerships with local organisations. While we didn't fully reach our 20% increase in tutoring goal yet, but the launch of our East Midlands Community Education Network is a key milestone, and we're excited to be addressing educational disparities starting with Nottingham to ensure more young people have access to the support they need to succeed.

Igniting Creative Sparks

We've made great strides in fostering student creativity, supporting access to music education, and releasing student-produced tracks on major streaming platforms. Through collaborations like our work with the A Cappella Society, we've showcased Midlands talent and laid a strong foundation to expand our outreach, engaging more societies to celebrate and amplify student creativity.

Mentoring for a Brighter Future

We've made great progress in launching our mentoring program, beginning in three regions, with plans underway to partner with EMWPREP, to track and enhance widening participation in the Midlands. By providing guidance on university admissions, apprenticeships, and other career pathways, we are empowering students and laying the groundwork for our plan for a nationwide initiative that will unlock the potential of young people and create lasting, positive change.

Transition to a CIO

In a pivotal moment this August, we successfully transitioned from a Charitable Company to become a registered charity with the Charity Commission, marking a significant milestone in our organisation's evolution. This transition has positioned us to better serve our community and expand our educational impact.

Financial Growth and Support

Our growth has been supported by a range of key funding sources, enabling us to expand and strengthen our services. A major grant facilitated the inception of our community education network scheme, and donations towards our online tutoring platform have enhanced accessibility, greatly improving our effectiveness for the families we support. NSEMM have been able to improve our operational capacity, enabling us to upscale and, helping us to maintain stability and deliver impactful support to our communities.

Digital and Community Innovation

We have worked with with Lessonspace to enhance our digital presence and transform our online tutoring platform. Designed for student engagement, the new system stores content within a low-latency server based in London, and integrates seamlessly with our in-house developed lesson hub. collaboration has strengthened our digital infrastructure, improving both accessibility and security, meaning parents now have better visibility into their children's educational progress.

Digital and Community Innovation

Throughout the year, we've maintained our commitment to specialised education, delivering focused music arranging classes with industry professionals. These sessions provided students with unique learning opportunities, combining technical expertise with creative expression to enrich their educational experience.



FINANCIAL STATEMENTS


For the fourth year in a row, we're <u>still</u> cheaper than our competitors.

Based on our research and their own publications, our main tutoring competitor, a large tutoring company, on average keep around £5.80 per lesson just as a platform fee, this is 55% of our average lesson cost, and their fee models alone could fund half of a lesson.



Whilst a for-profit model makes sense to prioritise platform revenue over tutor earnings, they are posting a £6.8 million loss suggesting inefficient use of high-margins. Parents pay 2-3x more in their model, while we achieve similar outcomes at 1/3 the price. The UK cost-of-living rose by 20.8% (Commons Library, 2023), meaning our tutoring is now more affordable than ever, particularly as other providers rates are still increasing.

Income Expenses



All of our salaries are pay for tutors, meaning 78.8% of our expenses go direct into our charitable work (tutoring). As education is very staff-intensive, a high percentage of our money goes directly into service delivery. Our other major costs, software and tech, is also directly related to service delivery, indicating a low administrative overhead in 2024. We aim to lock in contracts to keep our non-charitable overheads lower than 20% again next year.

OUR 2025 GOALS

Setting clear and measurable goals sits at the heart of our mission to bridge the educational divide. As a student-led charity, focused objectives help us create lasting change in communities that need it most, while ensuring our volunteers understand exactly how their work improves educational outcomes.

Local Libraries, Lasting Impact

The East Midlands Community Education Network will establish vital learning hubs across Nottingham's highest-need areas. Beginning with weekly sessions at St Ann's and Sneinton Libraries, we're collaborating with Nottingham City's Homework Help Sessions to maximise impact. Based on community demand, we plan to expand to other areas facing deprivation and lower educational attainment. By embedding our programme within local libraries, we're creating accessible spaces where students can access the resources and support needed to reach their full potential.

Careers Without Limits

We're expanding our mentoring reach beyond NSEMM Tutoring through strategic partnerships with specialist organisations. By focusing on competitive fields like medicine, we're providing expert guidance to students who currently lack access to these vital resources. Our targeted approach aims to bridge critical gaps in specialised educational support, particularly in underserved areas.

Tutoring Without Barriers

We're expanding our tutoring programme through securing funding to increase contact hours beyond last year's levels. Our enhanced bursary scheme and pay-what-you-can model directly addresses the cost of living crisis, ensuring families can maintain access to quality educational support regardless of their circumstances. This sustainable approach not only safeguards educational access for students but also provides vital paid employment for university tutors facing financial pressures.

Connecting Communities Through Education

We're expanding our Community Education Network beyond Nottingham to reach students across the Midlands, with initial focus on Derby and Birmingham. By encouraging young people to engage with their local libraries. we're building sustainable educational support networks that improve outcomes in areas of high deprivation. This regional growth enables us support more students whilst strengthening community resources.

The National Society for Education, Mentoring and Media takes an innovative approach to addressing educational inequality. Our strategy focuses on sustainability and growth, ensuring we can help more students while maintaining the quality of our programmes.

By positioning our services within trusted community spaces like libraries, we create lasting partnerships that strengthen local support networks. Our mixed model of paid tutoring and volunteer roles ensures both programme sustainability and broad community engagement.

Through targeted expansion and specialist partnerships, we're building a scalable framework that can be effectively implemented across different regions.
